The Second Reading 1 Peter 3:18-22


A Reading from the First Letter of Peter.



The Invitation to Holy Communion



Prelude - Down a Southern Lane - by Florence Price

Florence Price (1888 - 1953) was the first black woman to achieve distinction as a composer. A graduate of the New England Conservatory (1906), where she studied with George Chadwick and Frederick Converse, she continued her work at the Chicago Musical College and the American Conservatory of Music in the same city. Ms. Price began composing as a child and had published small pieces even before entering the Conservatory. After graduation she taught at Shorter College in her home town of Little Rock, Arkansas and at Clark College in Atlanta. Marriage in 1912 brought an end to her college teaching; thereafter she established a studio, all while continuing with her composing.

She won her first prize in 1925, her second in 1927, both in Holstein competitions. After settling in Chicago in 1927, she found publishers for her teaching pieces, a specialty for her. She wrote music for radio commercials in addition to serious compositions. Her works are in a variety of forms; three symphonies, two violin concertos, concert overtures, a piano concerto, chamber music, organ and piano pieces, teaching pieces, and arrangements of spirituals and other Negro folksongs.

Her Symphony in E minor, which won a Wanamaker prize in 1932, was given a first performance by the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, conducted by Frederick Stock, at the Chicago World's Fair in 1933, and was repeated several times by the orchestra. She was a black nationalist in that she drew freely upon folk idioms in her compositions. On June 3, 1953, Price died from a stroke in Chicago, Illinois, at age 66.

Closing - We'll Understand It Better By and By - by Charles Albert Tindley

Minister, gospel songwriter, and the first black to publish an original song collection, Charles Albert Tindley (1851 - 1933) was born in Berlin, Maryland. The son of slaves, he had few educational opportunities and taught himself to read and write. He also listened to spirituals and campmeeting songs and developed a love of music. This enthusiasm led him to teach himself music composition.

After his marriage, he moved to Philadelphia in search of better economic conditions. After a few jobs, he became the sexton for the John Wesley Methodist Episcopal Church. While working there he completed his education via correspondence school and passed the examination to become a minister. He started his ministerial career in 1885. After several pastoral assignments in New Jersey and Delaware, he returned to Philadelphia to pastor the Bainbridge Street Methodist Church, the new name of the church where he had previously served as sexton. He spent the rest of his career there, building the church's membership to ten thousand. Rev. Tindley achieved great fame as a preacher, orator, civil rights worker and champion of Philadelphia's poor. However, his greatest accomplishment was in gospel music.

In 1927 he formed the Tindley Gospel Singers, who spread their pastor's songs throughout the country. They were the first from the Baptist tradition to be accompanied by a piano. They were pioneers who sang some of the earliest gospel songs.

Two of Tindley's most popular songs are "We'll Understand it Better By and By" (aka By and By) and "Take Your Burden to the Lord, Leave It There" (aka Leave It There). His song "I'll Overcome Some Day was reconstituted to "We Shall Overcome" and adopted as the anthem of the Civil Rights Movement of the 1960's. He died on July 26, 1933 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.
